### Course Description

A one-day symposium to educate practicing pathologists and clinicians on contemporary clinical-pathologic and molecular correlates to the diagnosis and management of colorectal carcinoma, inflammatory bowel disease, and head and neck diseases. Additionally, the symposium will commemorate the 120th anniversary of the Pathology Department at Mount Sinai and the seminal contributions of Dr. Paul Klemperer.

# At the conclusion of this activity, participants will be able to:

- Describe the controversial issues and ambiguities inherent in the current TNM system for staging of colorectal cancer and the Bethedsa classification for thyroid cytopathology.
- Delineate the genetic alterations that occur in colorectal and thyroid carcinoma and their impact on prognosis and therapeutic decisions.
- Summarize the correlations between genotype and pathologic phenotype in patients with ulcerative colitis and Crohn's disease, their pathogenetic significance, and their potential relevance to therapy and clinic management.
- Discuss the ways in which pathology and molecular reports impact on the prognosis, therapy and clinical management of patients with colorectal cancer.
- Discuss the importance of deep remission in the therapy of patients with chronic IBD and the potential role of histopathological endpoints in therapeutic trials and patient management.
- Describe the pathology and immunobiology of HPV-related head and cancers and the potential role of immunotherapy.

### Who Should Attend

Physicians, both practicing and in-training, who have interests in both scientific and diagnostic techniques for both gastrointestinal and head and neck pathology.
